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LAUNCH OF CHILD HEALTH POLICY TO POLICY MAKERS AND CE CANDIDATES Professional Forum on Child Health Policy 2017

During the Chief Executive (CE) Election Campaign, Professional Forum on Child Health Policy 2017 was held on 9 Mar 2017 at Room 607, 6/F, 3 Lockhart Road, Wan Chai, Hong Kong. Speakers included Dr. Chan Chok Wan, Dr. Lilian Wong, Ms. Sylvia Siu, Legal Group Convenor and Mr. Richard Yip, Barrister. All the CE candidates have been invited but finally only Mr. Woo Kwok Hing and Mr. Hon. Cheung Chiu Hung Fernando, legislative council member have joined. The Forum was successful and well attended by academics, professionals from medical, nursing, allied health, social, education, legal, the members of Election Committee as well as public media. The advocacy towards having a Child Health Policy and a Children Commissioner in Hong Kong were strongly supported by Mr. Woo Kwok Hing, Dr. Hon. Cheung Chiu Hung, Fernando and many other professionals in the forum. Besides, Ms Sylvia Siu, Convenor of Legal Sectoral Functional Group announced the messages from Ms. Leung Oi Sie Elsie, former Secretary of Justice, HKSAR; Mr. Thomas So, The President of the Law Society of Hong Kong and Mr. Hon. Dennis Kwok, Legco member of Legal Constituency that all indicated their support to the establishment of Child Health Policy and the Children Commissioner for Hong Kong. Strategies for actions discussed in the forum included promotion to the public on the needs on Child Health Policy through media and setting up Legislative Ordinance through LegCo. Professionals from different disciplines all agreed to join together and work cohesively towards this noble mission.

Dr. Chan Chok Wan, Dr. Lilian Wong Dr. Daniel Chiu and Dr. Hon. Cheung Chiu Hung, Fernando met Mr. Woo Kwok Hing, CE Candidate on 28 Feb 2017, Dr. Chan introduced to him the background and the need for establishment of a comprehensive Child Health Policy and a Children Commissioner for Hong Kong. Recent incidents such as lead in water, youth suicide etc. evidenced that the existing policies in Hong Kong was in piecemeal. Moreover, children's issues were discussed under Family Council which has only advisory role. There was a need for an independent Children Commissioner to coordinate and oversee the child health issues, monitor the implementation of policies and evaluate the

outcomes. The Children Commissioner should be positioned above the Bureaus and report directly to the Chief Executive of HKSAR government. It was so pleased that this proposal was well supported by Mr. Woo.

"HKPF - Youth Voice"香港兒科基金 (青年之聲) in the Child Health Panel Meeting at Legislative Council on 25 Mar 2017

A Child Health Panel meeting was held on 25 Mar 2017 pm at the Legislative Council chaired by Dr. Hon. Cheung Chiu Hung, Fernando. It provided a good platform for the public to express the children's views and expectations to the Hong Kong Government.

The Youth Group of Hong Kong Paediatric Foundation (HKPF) has joined this meeting and voiced out their opinions and expectations to the government on seven key areas: 1) The Definition of Child Health, 2) Children's Right according to United Nation Convention of Right for Children 3) The Child Health Problems and Challenges in Hong Kong in past years e.g. Mental health problem - youth's suicide; environmental problem – lead poisoning etc. 4) Health Literacy, 5) The Imminent Need for a Comprehensive Child Health Policy for Hong Kong, 6) Youths' Views on having a Child Health Policy and its long term benefit and cost effectiveness and 7) The Need for a Children Commissioner to coordinate, monitor the implementation of policies and evaluate the child health outcomes.

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They also reminded the government that "Now children represent 20% of our population but 100% of our Future". They hoped the government would listen to their voices and take actions to address their needs.

Media Interview on Alcohol Survey and Child Health Policy

A survey on 1,957 secondary school students from form 1 – form 6 on alcohol consumption has been conducted from 17 Mar 2016 to 5 May 2016. The aim of the study is to understand the current state of youth taking alcohol so that appropriate action such as public health education could be provided accordingly. Result showed that the average age of children taking alcohol for the first time was 10.6; 16% of children taking alcohol the first time were less than 6 years old. 17% respondents had binge drinking with an average of 3.9 times in the past month. 48% of students believed that taking alcohol was acceptable if not taking excessively. 43% believed that taking red wine was good to health. 69% took alcohol with their family. 37% of students were even invited by family to take alcohol on the festive day. It revealed a wrong concept from the youth and family that taking alcohol has no harm to health if it was not taken excessively. A media interview was held on 21 Mar 2017 for this survey to reflect the public's misconception and the need of establishment of Child Health Policy and the Children Commissioner to oversee the child health issues. The survey result was published on Ming Pao, Oriental Daily and Am 730.





PUBLIC FORUM ON CHILD HEALTH 2017 兒童健康論壇

兒童健康論壇 - 「香港的中學課程, 適合我們的年青人嗎?」 was held on 18 Mar 2017, invited speakers included Mr. Hon. Ip Kin Yuen, Legislative Council Member and Mr. Cheng Chun Fat, Secondary School Supervisor, former Inspector of Education Bureau and former Secondary School Principal. The forum was well attended with parents, academics and professors in the education sectors. In the Forum, Mr. Hon. Ip Kin Yuen showed the video from Education Bureau Curriculum Reform Year 2000 and briefed the audience about the "Fundamental Concept of the Secondary School Curriculum". He also commented on the design of the Territory Wide System Assessment (TSA) and the reason for its failure in its implementation. Mr. Cheng talked about the "Impact of Curriculum Reform in Hong Kong Secondary School on Students". He commented on the change of school curriculum, students only studied those selected subjects which would be tested and omitted those with important core value of the subject. Moreover, schools and parents were too focused on the academic result and the study in university. This created undue stress and unhappiness to the students. He emphasized that individual possessed their own talent. Different learning and career path should be provided for students to develop their interest and potential. He also quoted a successful story of his student who quit DSE and developed his career based on his interest. His talk won the audiences' resonances. In the forum, it was commented that the education system changed every 5 years without long term planning. A parent of a child with special educational needs (SEN) shared his child's difficulty in facing the high competition in the society. It was concluded that the secondary school curriculum should be revised, students should be taught less and explored more by themselves and more learning opportunities and career paths should be provided for the youth.

Speaker was Prof. Paul Chan, Chairman, Department of Microbiology, The Chinese University of Hong Kong. The meeting was well attended and welcome by audiences.

Update on the Management Guideline for Urinary Tract Infection in Children was held on 7 Feb 2017 at the Chairman's Suite and Executive Room, World Trade Centre Club, Causeway Bay. Speaker was Dr. Wong Sik Nin. Consultant Paediatric Department of Paediatrics, Tuen Mun Hospital; Immediate Past President of the Hong Kong College of Paediatricians. The talk was fruitful and well attended by child health care professionals.

Update on the Management of Pre-school wheezing was held on 7 Mar 2017 at the Chairman's Suite and Executive Room, World Trade Centre Club, Causeway Bay. The talk was delivered by Dr. Alfred Tam, Chairman of the Paediatric Respiratory Medicine (PRM) Subspecialty Board. The talk was fruitful and well attended by child health care professionals.
