Survey Overview

Survey Objectives	 To understand the prevalence of child home injury in HK and parents' attitude toward it. To identify the leading black spots of child home injury in HK.
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Survey Organizations	The Hong Kong Paediatric Foundation and Rotary International District 3450 (Hong Kong, Macao & Mongolia)
Data Processing	Public Opinion Programme, The University of Hong Kong
Survey Respondents	HK parents with at least one child aged below six
Survey Period	November 2008 – January 2009
Methodology	Questionnaire
Successful Samples	Number of questionnaire distributed: 3,504
	Return of completed questionnaires: 1,296
	Response rate: 37% (HK:96%/ Macao: 4%)




Survey Findings

1. Incidence of child home injury in HK

61% of respondents' child aged from 3 – 6 years old had suffered from home injury before

Amongst the respondents' child who had suffered from home injury They had experienced home injury for 6 times on average












Leading child home injuries:


Falling, bumping into objects, being caught between objects, Being bitten by insects or animals

Bumping into objects, mosquito bites, being caught in door



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





2. Medical consultation subsequent to child home injury

Over 40% of injured kids needed medical consultation








20% of injured kids had received medical tests 92% of them had received X-ray








A quarter of injured kids required hospitalization 20% was sent to hospital for at least two times









21% of injured kids had received medical treatment 77% of them received wound stitching and dressing






3. Timing susceptible to child home injury

Q: Which seasons did those home injuries take place?












66% of child home injury took place during weekends

Q: Which day of the week did those home injuries take place?



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






90% of child home injury took place from afternoon to night time

Q: Which time segment did those home injuries take place?












4. Parents' attitude toward child home injury

Q: Who take care of the child during day time?













12% of respondents had left their child at home alone before








47% of respondents thought that the key reason for their child's home injury was : Oversight of the care-giver

Q: What were the reasons for your child's home injury?












46% of respondents considered the care-giver should bear the responsibility for their child's home injury

Q: Who should be responsible for child home injury?












90% of respondents said they would feel bad if their child suffered from home injury

Q: Would you feel bad if your child suffers from home injury?












44% of respondents would feel bad about their child's home injury 32% would be worried about the long-term consequence of the injury on their child

Q: How would your child's home injury affect your mood?












74% of respondents considered child home injury was preventable

Q: Do you think child home injury is preventable?












55% of respondents considered their knowledge of preventing child home injury is so and so

Q: Do you have a good grasp of the preventive measures of child home injury?












5. Parents' behavior toward preventing child home injury


77% of respondents said they would check the black spots of child home injury on a regular basis

Yet only 13% would practise it constantly and daily






Reasons for <u>having not</u> checked the black spots for child home injury regularly:

Q: Why didn't you check the black spots for child home injury on a regular basis?












50% of respondents would keep a well-equipped first aid box at home Only 27% parents would learn first aid knowledge Only 1% would teach their child on what was dangerous

Summary

Incidence of child home injury in HK

- 61% of respondents' child aged from 3 6 years old had suffered from home injury before, and they have experience home injury for 6 times on average; mainly are
 - Bumping into objects
 - Bumping into objects (48%)
 - Falling on the ground (34%)
 - Falling from bed (31%)
 - Slipping in bathroom (28%)
 - Falling from chair (10%)
 - Fighting with siblings & other kids (9%)
 - Being caught between objects
 - Being caught in door (35%)
 - Being caught by wardrobe door or drawer (8%)
 - Others
 - Being bitten by mosquitoes (48%)
 - Choking (10%)









Medical consultation subsequent to child home injury

- 40% had sought for medical consultation.
- 20% of injured kids had received medical tests, of which 92% were X-ray.
- A quarter of injured kids required hospitalization, of which 20% was hospitalized for at least two times.
- 21% of injured kids had received medical treatment, of which 77% were wound stitching and dressing.









Timing susceptible to child home injury

- Summer
- Weekends
- From afternoon to night time
- The above are time segments that children tend to stay at home longer (such as summer holidays, weekends, school holidays or after schools...etc). Parents should be vigilant about that.





Parents were eager to prevent child home injury yet their knowledge was inadequate

- Leaving child at home is susceptible to home injury. Yet 12% of respondents had left their child at home alone before, amongst which 10% had done this for over 10 times.
- Most parents considered oversight of the care-givers was to blame for their child's home injury; and thus should bear all the responsibilities.
- Most parents would feel bad if their child suffered from home injury. They would worry about the long-term consequences of the injury to their child.
- Most respondents considered child home injury was preventable; yet admitted that their knowledge of preventing child home injury was so and so.









Parents were keen to prevent child home injury yet were poorly-equipped

- Most respondents said they would check the black spots of child home injury regularly; yet in reality the frequency was not enough.
- Some parents did not conduct any checking because they thought it was useless or did not know how to do it.
- 50% of parents would keep a well-equipped first aid box at home; only 27% would learn first aid knowledge; and only 1% would teach their child on what was dangerous.





















Black spots of falls: Level ground and bed




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Black spot of Hits: Bumping into objects




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Black spot of insect & animal bites: Mosquito bites









Black spots of being caught between objects: Entrance door/ room door










Black spot of slippery: Bathroom










Black spots of <u>scalding</u>: When drinking hot water













Black spots of cutting & piercing: Pencil/ Scissor







Black spot of choking: Being choked by food when eating










Black spot of burns: Iron/ cigarettes/ cooking stove




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Black spots of electricity leakage: Electrical socket




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Black spot of poisoning: Mistakenly swallowed OTC drugs










Black spot of suffocation: When covering with blanket
